WOMEN OF ASPHALT & SAPA Partnership Agreement

Asplialt Pavement Association (SAPA) is to provide a minually beneficial partnership that provides value is the industry by creating a community of support and advocating for women in the asplialt workforce. The mission of the WofA organization is to lead and inspire women with the purpose of increased recruitment and retention of women in the asphalt industry. SAPA zations and WofA will work together to support the mission by creating state WofA branches. Should a SAPA so desire, the branches will be embedded into the organizational

Together, the SAPA and the WofA will support state branches through collaborative efforts as

- All events, outreach and messaging of the WolfA state branch shall embody the mission vision and goals of rational WofA.
- 2. SAPA state branches and national WorA will share information for mutual distribution Designated forms are upcoming events, post-event reports, information for new members, now programs, suggested social media advertising or any other information from either partner that supports the mission of WofA state branches and WofA nationally
- 3. The KAPA will establish the store WolfA branch as a designated committee or team within SAPA that is led by a Chairwoman and Vice-Chairwoman: The WofA branch Chairwoman will serve as a liamon to the national Work to facilitate information exchange among the branches and ensure state activities and branding comply with mission, goals and guidelines of national WolA. The WolA branch Chairwoman may also report to the SAPA Board of Directors at the discretion of the SAPA Executive Director.
- 4. The Work beauch shall hold a minimum of two events/meetings each year. The SAPA is encouraged to assist the branch in some capacity with these events (i.e. providing meeting space, slavinhating event information). Both WofA national and SAPA local branches will moourage and support mutual membership.

WorfA and SAPA Partnership Agree

- National WoLA will provide the SAPA a guidebook that includes beauding requirements (esyle, merchandising and pair/schag). If the need to deviate from these branding requirements occurs, the SAPA will need approval from National WoLA.
- b. The SAPA will have the financial responsibility of the state WolfA branch. If National WolfA provides support money to the SAPA for WolfA branch events, National WolfA may request an annual report of activities and financial to eview of how these funds are utilized. to support branch outreach and vents. The SAPA will ensure any fundraising efforts or donatons collected specifically for the state WoRA branch will be designated solely for that purpose. If required, the SAPA shall make advance payment and sign contract for a branch event.

This agreement is effective upon execution and will continue in full force until either partner gives written notice to the other party to terminate the Agreement
