

Legislative Priorities

- ✓ Timely Highway Reauthorization
 - Address Highway Trust Fund Insolvency - \$250 Billion shortfall
- ✓ Buy America and IIJA Implementation (& Tariffs)
- ✓ FAA Reauthorization and Airfield Pavement Technology Program (AFTP)
- ✓ Maintain Sustainability – RAP & The Road Forward
 - Advocate for increased RAP utilization
- ✓ Prioritize and Improve Work Zone Safety
- ✓ Strike PFAS Liability for Pavement Materials



Work Zone Safety Advocacy

- ✓ **Bringing WZS leadership to Capitol Hill**
 - WZS Contingency Fund (WZSCF) **implementation**
 - Appropriations language and Senate Resolution
 - Tours with Congressional Representatives
- ✓ **Kicking off the Coalition**
 - T&I hearings and stakeholder engagement

- ✓ **Administration changes will help but unlikely a panacea**
- ✓ **EPA released a flurry of regulations Nov. 5 through Jan. 19**
 - Some will be difficult to strike or claw-back
- ✓ **NAPA's EH&S Committee structure is:**
 - Health & Safety | Environmental

Health & Safety Priorities

- ✓ **PRIORITIZE Work Zone Safety**
- ✓ **Increase Mental Health Awareness**
- ✓ **Facilitate Heat Illness Prevention**
- ✓ **Address, assist, and comply with Chlorinated Solvents Ban**
 - Less than ~ a dozen state DOTs require binder solvent extraction
 - QA labs will need to identify/control exposure and implement Chemical Hygiene Plan
- ✓ **Manage Vehicle Fleet / Transportation Risk**





Heat Illness Prevention

- Developed road construction worker HIPP
 - Compliant w/ NEP and state standards | practical
 - Temp / HI triggers – water / rest / shade
- NAPA commented on Proposed OSHA Standard
 - Focused on equivalent shade alternatives
- Doubtful rule survives Trump Admin



Chlorinated Solvent Bans – Binder Extraction

- EPA finalizes bans on use of Cl-solvents
- DCM, TCE, and PERC – w/ some exemptions
- EPA setting OELs (and monitoring reqmts)
 - EPA OELs between 10 and 10,000 times lower than OSHA's
- Prelim IH monitoring indicates additional controls needed
- Researching alternative solvents / methods – will take time
- Action: understand lab set-up & controls / monitor / manage

- First time Env Justice litigated for a Minor Source
- The Case: Plaintiffs, Defendants, and Appellants
- Everybody loses & nobody's happy






Addressing misperceptions & communicating risk

- Some people rely on the ‘internet’ as authoritative; it’s more complicated than that
- Paving and roofing asphalt are different
- Paving asphalt is classified as ‘non-hazardous’
- Asphalt is a petroleum product and may have some odor and very low emissions at high temperatures
- Mix plant emissions are from the combustion of fuel, extremely well-characterized, and amounts are similar to dry-cleaners, gas stations, restaurants, etc.

Product & Environmental Stewardship: Leachate (RAP, in-service)

“ We might have a problem with our roads: researchers have discovered that sunlight and rain might be able to turn certain compounds in asphalt into potentially dangerous hydrocarbons, threatening surrounding environment and people ...”



RAP Leachate: safety continues to be validated !

- Ongoing research continues to question inertness of leachate from pavement and RAP
- Asphalt is inert and waterproof
- Vehicle- and tire-wear depositions are increasingly being studied
- Recent study by Fla DOT & DEC will hopefully end uncertainty






- 6 RAP sources






- Ongoing Calif (ban) and USEPA concerns re tire rubber runoff






