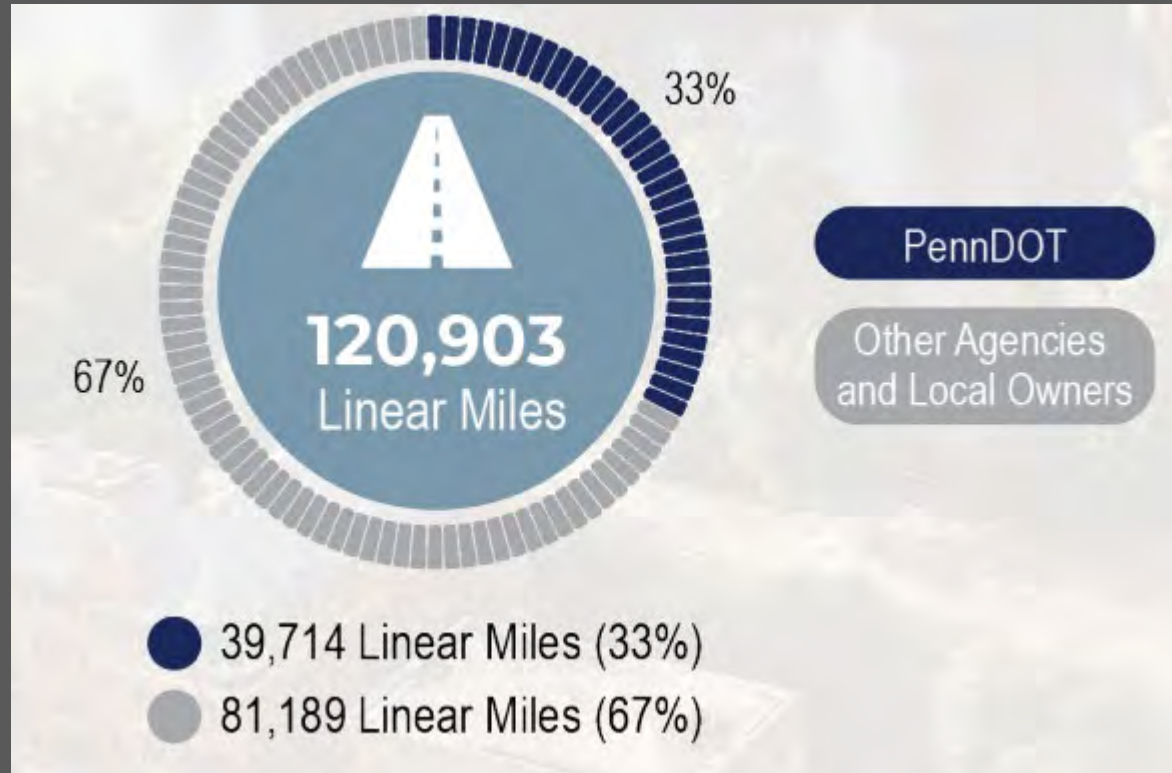

WOMEN OF ASPHALT & SAPA Partnership Agreement

The goal of establishing this partnership between Women of Asphalt® (WoA) and the State Asphalt Pavement Association (SAPA) is to provide a mutually beneficial partnership that provides value to the industry by creating a community of support and advocating for women in the asphalt workforce. The mission of the WoA organization is to lead and inspire women with the purpose of increased recruitment and retention of women in the asphalt industry. SAPA organizations and WoA will work together to support the mission by creating state WoA branches. Should a SAPA so desire, the branches will be embedded into the organizational structure of the state association.

Together, the SAPA and the WoA will support state branches through collaborative efforts as noted:

1. All events, outreach and messaging of the WoA state branch shall embody the mission, vision and goals of national WoA.
2. SAPA state branches and national WoA will share information for mutual distribution. Designated items are upcoming events, post-event reports, information for new members, new programs, suggested social media advertising or any other information from either partner that support the mission of WoA state branches and WoA nationally.
3. The SAPA will establish the state WoA branch as a designated committee or team within the SAPA that is led by a Chairwoman and Vice-Chairwoman. The WoA branch Chairwoman will serve as a liaison to the national WoA to facilitate information exchange among the branches and ensure state activities and branding comply with mission, goals and guidelines of national WoA. The WoA branch Chairwoman may also report to the SAPA Board of Directors at the discretion of the SAPA Executive Director.
4. The WoA branch shall hold a minimum of two events/meetings each year. The SAPA is encouraged to assist the branch in some capacity with these events (i.e. providing meeting space, distributing event information). Both WoA, national and SAPA local branches will encourage and support mutual membership.

5. National WoA will provide the SAPA a guidebook that includes branding requirements (style, merchandising and marketing). If the need to deviate from these branding requirements occurs, the SAPA will need approval from National WoA.
6. The SAPA will have the financial responsibility of the state WoA branch. If National WoA provides support money to the SAPA for WoA branch events, National WoA may request an annual report of activities and financial overview of how these funds are utilized to support branch outreach and events. The SAPA will ensure any fundraising efforts or donations collected specifically for the state WoA branch will be designated solely for that purpose. If required, the SAPA shall make advance payment and sign contract for a branch event.

This agreement is effective upon execution and will continue in full force until either partner gives written notice to the other party to terminate the Agreement.
